Welcome June! I'm sure everyone is looking forward to the beginning of the summer holidays and the relaxed pace it brings.

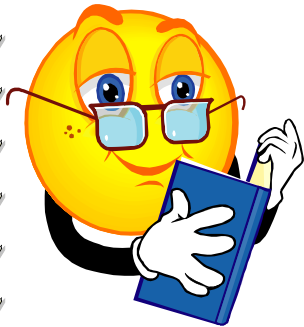

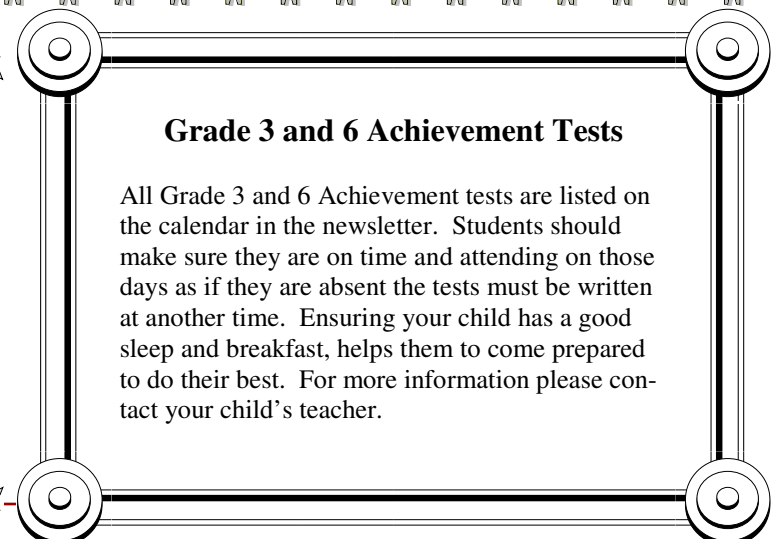
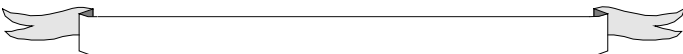


Awards Assembly

Basics of Home Alone and What Every Babysitter Should Know Programs

This spring we made available two very worthwhile programs offered by Mrs. Heather Smith-Schenkey. For students who are 9 or 10 they were given the opportunity to enroll in The Basics of Home Alone which teaches basic skills about being home alone for short periods of time to young children. Material covered included telephone safety, basic first aid, internet safety, healthy snacks and activities and games to name a few topics.

The second program is What Every Babysitter Should Know which will run for two days beginning Tuesday, June 7th for our Grade 6 students (11 year olds). It is a course prepared by the St. John Ambulance and teaches skills necessary to care for infants, toddlers and pre-schoolers. It emphasizes safety, dealing with emergencies and first aid basics. 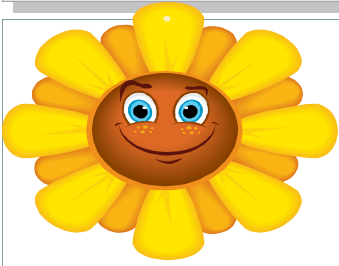
